Qualtrics Survey Design

- Initial survey link has four main sections:
 - First section, introduction of available benefits and what ECC can offer.

Qualtrics Survey Design (Continued)

- Each embedded link will open to a new tab, leaving the initial survey open for students to check the remaining of the links.
- Students email address is needed to track their clicks and visits to SNAP& Medicaid and WIC Websites.
- Three other Qualtrics forms are created (SNAP, Medicaid and WIC) to count the clicks. These separate links are embedded to the initial survey, but it is not visible to students.

Qualtrics Survey Distribution

Qualtrics Survey Distribution

- Embedded official website links will be tracked by each click in Qualtrics.
- Response rate, participation rate and complete survey data is recorded on Qualtrics dashboard.
- Post survey outreach to students who submitted a complete response.



Responses as of June 1st, 2024

- Initial email was sent to 2514 email addresses.
- Total of 408 students opened the email and clicked on the link.
- Among those 259 completed the entire survey and submitted.
- 151 total clicks/visits were made to SNAP official website
- 50 total clicks/visits were made to Medicaid official website
- 23 total clicks/visits were made to WIC official website



• Next Steps:

- Perform a post survey data from students who participated in the survey
- Analyze data to determine ease of use
- What student liked or dislike about the survey
- Use data to redesign the survey
- Major launch in the Fall 2024 semester
