The Fall Visit

- We visit the partner school
- Facilitate NJCAN Career Cluster assessment
- Students discover groups of occupations that interest them, learn the education and skills needed, and explore popular jobs
- The most popular career clusters shape the Spring visit



The Fall Visit Pt. 2

- Time For Payback game: teaches students how to minimize student debt and handle crucial college decisions
- College basics presentation: what a degree is, earning credit early, and other FAQs



The Spring Visit





- Reality Check: Using real careers and local salaries, students simulate a month of living on their own
- "Life Happens" surprise
- Group Reflection
- Demonstrates the value of higher education
- Builds financial literacy skills for outside of the classroom

Reality Check Examples

How to determine your monthly budget

Your career card has your **yearly salary**: how much money you would make in one year, before taxes.

Deduct \$10,000 from your yearly salary to get your salary after taxes.

Yearly Salary = \$ -\$10,000 = \$ (your net salary).

2 Divide your net salary by 12 months to get your monthly salary.

Net Salary = \$ $\div 12 = $$ (your monthly salary).

3 If you are married, add \$1000 to your monthly salary (to include your spouse's income). Add nothing if unmarried.

Monthly Salary = \$ +\$1000 = \$

My Monthly Income: \$

Example

- Salary on Career Card = \$45,000 (And Married).
- \$45,000 \$10,000 = \$35,000 after taxes.
- $$35,000 \div 12 = $2,917 \text{ per month.}$
- \$2,917 + \$1000 from Spouse = **\$3,917 per month**.

Optional Savings Tip:

- It is recommended that 20% of one's monthly income goes into their savings.
- Take your monthly salary and divide it by 5 to get your recommended savings amount.

Success Bound aims to prepare Perth Amboy, South Amboy, and Carteret youth to develop the necessary skills to become successful learners and future college students.

Four goals:

- Increase post-secondary enrollment
- Develop soft-skills
- Gain civic engagement
- Reduce remedial placement in college-level courses.
- Year-long with either a 1- or 2-year commitment inclusive of a 5-week summer institute.
- Aims to equip participants with the support the scholar will need to be a motivated student prepared for college through learning:
- Time management, how to work in groups, goal setting, College/FAFSA application process and career exploration





- Weekly Tutoring during the summer institute



Dover College Promise Overview

- The Dover College Promise (DCP) program was created out of the need arising from a disconnect with the Dover, NJ school district, which is highly diverse. Only 3 miles from CCM. Additionally, due to the lower high school and college graduation rates within that school district. This was a significantly underserved community for CCM.
- Partnership with a local college prep after-school program. Cohorts 10th and 11th graders.
- With private funding, we were able to start DCP with 25 high school sophomores, one coordinator, one student specialist, and the college's resources.
- The program included evening/weekly career and personal assessments, essay writing, public speaking, personal finance, and high-impact community projects. Sessions were bi-lingual.
- Parent engagement workshops. Topics included college expectations, financial aid, accessing resources, and their student's college path.

Community Projects / Engagement



- Development of a local walking trail in an area of a park that had gone under disrepair.
- Creation of a Dover historical student club at Dover High School.
- Production of a video commemorating the 300th anniversary of the founding of Dover.
- Close collaboration with the Dover Historical Society to support their programming, fostering students' sense of belonging and ownership of the community they live in. CCM Faculty and staff connection.
- Students split into different groups to manage their projects, meeting with local town officials, founders, peers, and other influential members of the community.



Morristown College Promise

- Due to the success of DCP, we initiated the Morristown College Promise at Morristown High School last year.
- 30 students, half ESL, half English speakers, started the program during the school day with a similar workshop/session format as Dover.
- The teams are currently organizing and brainstorming different community projects, both in Morristown, though they seem to prefer developing projects within the school community.
- We have started recruitment activities for both Morristown and Dover with the support of guidance counselors and school principals.



Program Success and Expansion

- 70% of the students who started the program are currently enrolled at CCM with a retention rate of 100% from fall to spring.
- These students are leaders within the CCM community, and half of them participated in the EOF summer orientation program.
- Other school districts have indicated an interest in developing programs as they see a huge need in their communities that could be alleviated our program.
- We continue to work with the college administration and the Foundation to raise funds from private companies, foundations, and other philanthropic endeavors to maintain the program.



Program Expansion and Partnerships

- A new class of 25 students from Dover High School will join the 17 already enrolled.
- Morristown plans to increase its high school enrollment from 30 to 60 students.
- Dover students will collaborate with local administration to open a new trail and dog park.
- Emerging partners from private industry, local government, and philanthropic sources are supporting program growth.
- The CCM Foundation dedicated 100% of raised funds to CCM College Promise programs this year.
